Dear Families,

During the last week, all of children from reception to year six have taken part in assessments; some formal and some informal.

All of the assessments are used to inform us of the next steps to move your children on academically. The children have had a very unsettled year and this has straddled across two academic year. We are working very hard to ensure that all children receive the support that they need. The results will be shared with you next week at parent's evening.



To celebrate the children's hard work, we are having a well-being and personal development day tomorrow across the school. This will run alongside the Red Nose Day activities. I have worked with the Head Boy and Head Girl to decide on the activities for tomorrow.

All classes will begin with a class liturgy and will be followed by a class based road safety session. This is very important as the traffic has been quieter during the lockdowns, but it is gradually increasing and children need the reminder on how to behave sensibly whilst on the road and pavements. There is also an increasing amount of electric cars on the road, the previous STOP, LOOK and LISTEN message has changed to STOP, LOOK, LISTEN and THINK.



The classes will also be completing activities on the use of social media, listening skills, an exploring feelings activity and they will sharing their personal strengths with the class.

We are celebrating 'super hero' day tomorrow for Red Nose Day. I know some staff are taking the opportunity to wear a cape, but some staff are thinking outside the box.
