### The curriculum leader will:

- Understand and articulate the expectations of the curriculum to support high quality teaching and support staff in the delivery of this.
- Ensure an appropriate progression of skills document is in place which ensures continuity, progression and knowledge / skills development throughout the age phases.
- Monitor progression of skills and knowledge throughout year groups using the assessment grid criteria information.
- Support teachers when supporting struggling children and extend more competent children, celebrating the achievements of all.
- Ensure an appropriate progression for vocabulary and skills is in place for each phase of learning, which builds on prior learning.
- Keep up to date with subject developments and share good practise and support materials eg. Transition project.

Our classrooms will:

- Provide appropriate quality equipment for each area of the curriculum.
- Have developed displays which include actual pieces of work, examples of the big question being studied, secondary source materials and carefully chosen vocabulary, and which are regularly updated.
- Be organised so that pupils can work in small groups or whole class as appropriate to support pupils in their development of their skills.
- Deploy appropriately challenging selections of texts, both non-fiction and fiction, accessible throughout learning to develop wider understanding and underpin reading skills.

Displays around school and work books will show:

- Pupils have had opportunities for practice and refinement of skills.
- A varied and engaging curriculum which develops a range of geographical skills.
- Developed and final pieces of work which showcase the skills learned.
- Clear progression of skills in line with expectations set out in the progression grids.
- That pupils, over time, develop a range of skills and make links across all of the areas of the geography curriculum.

# The class teacher will, with support from the curriculum leader:

- Create a long term plan which ensures appropriate coverage of knowledge, skills and vocabulary from the progression grid.
- Personally pursue support for any particular subject knowledge and skills gaps prior to teaching.
- Ensure that resources are appropriate, of high enough quality and are plentiful so that all pupils have the correct tools and materials.

### Our children will be:

- Engaged because they are challenged by the curriculum which they are provided with.
- Resilient learners who overcome barriers and understand their own strengths and areas for development.
- Able to critique their own work as a geographer because they know how to be successful.
- Are safe and happy in geography lessons which give them opportunities to explore their own creative development.
- Encouraged and nurtured to overcome any barriers to their learning or self-confidence because feedback is positive and focuses geographical skills and knowledge
- Develop geographical and links on the website skills and confidence over time because of careful planning, focused delivery and time to practise and hone skills.

### The curriculum leader will:

- Celebrate the successes of pupils through planned displays and links on the website.
- Collate appropriate evidence over time which evidences that pupils know more and remember more
- Monitor the standards in the subject to ensure the outcomes are at expected levels.
- Provide ongoing CPD support based on the outcomes of subject monitoring to ensure that the impact of the curriculum is wide reaching and positive.
