<u>Lent</u>

It is the beginning of Lent on Wednesday 2nd March. We will be encouraging the children to take part in the 40 days of kindness where each day they think of others and help them to feel happy. Over the holidays, you could try to help them think of 40 ideas.

Mrs. Colley will be inviting parents and children in school during Lent to take part in prayerful activities.

COVID-19

School life is slowly resuming to normal. Assemblies and school worship in the hall have both restarted and we are aiming to have the school gathering as a whole after half term. All restrictions have been lifted in the dining hall and outside.

Family learning

Mrs. Walker is continuing family learning sessions this term. Letters will be sent out to individual classes. Family Learning aims to raise the confidence of adult family members, by equipping them with the skills and knowledge needed to become more involved in their children's learning and social development.

Restart of SEND Coffee mornings

We are restarting the coffee mornings for families of those identified as a special education need/disability or those who receive additional support. They will run on the first Thursday of each month. The coffee morning will give you the opportunity to talk to other parents who are in a similar situation to yourself. The sessions are very informal.

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Outdoor play

The senior leadership team are reviewing the equipment and outdoor set up at lunch time. We are aware that the children behave differently on a lunchtime as they are outside for a longer period of time. Mrs. Colley and I are now often outside with the children and have identified that the children need more play equipment to engage them. We have previously spent a lot of money on toys, but they quickly break. To help overcome this, we are engaging the children with meaningful activities, encouraging the children to look after the equipment and we have four year 5 pupils who have trained as Sport's Leaders and they are going to help arrange the activities.

Commando Joe Days

Each half term, the children will take part in a Commando Joe Day where the children take part in missions and develop their social skills.

The children can come to school in their PE kits or Commando style clothing. Commando style face paints are allowed, but remember that the children are moving around a lot and become sweaty. We will also provide face paints on the yard on the morning of a Commando Joe day, but parents will need to be with their child. If the child would like this, then it will only be 2 stripes of camouflage colour on each cheek.

School site

Following the storm a few weeks ago, we are hopeful that the loose tiles on the roof will be fixed in the half term holiday. The heating in the reception class is due to be fully fixed by mid-March. The play equipment at the front of school is getting fully replaced in the summer term and the gym equipment will be ready to use again after the holidays. Please keep your children off the equipment before and after school.

Most messages come through Class DoJo- please make sure that you have logged on to this system. Ask for help if needed.

<u>Clubs</u>

After school clubs will be released during the week that we return from school. We are pleased that so many children stay and we take their opinion on what to run. Payments must be paid via parent pay; if payments are not made then the children will not be able to stay for a club. We often have to pay external providers for the provision and school end up having to pay, which is not ideal. If you would like your child to attend a club, but payment is difficult then please speak to a member of school staff about this. We will support where possible.

Arrears

Unfortunately, some families are in arrears for dinners, nursery fees, clubs and wraparound; we know that this can be difficult, but we are here to support you and can set up a payment plan to help. We will also help you avoid more debts occurring. Mrs. Smith, our office manager, can meet individually and privately with families to help. She can be contacted on the school email or via Class DoJo.

Nursery places

We are pleased to announce that we have full-time and part-time nursery spaces available for 2, 3 or 4 year olds. Mrs. Smith, will be able to discuss the payment options and can easily check if families are entitled to free hours.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee

You will be aware that the Queen's Platinum Jubilee day is within the school holiday in June. Due to this, schools have been able to allocate an additional date. Bishop Chadwick Catholic Education Trust schools are taking this date on July 22nd 2022, so school will be closed on this date. We have a school INSET day on July 21st 2022, therefore school will close for the summer to the pupils on Wednesday July 20th 2022.
